In November, we got the opportunity to collaborate with a fellow social enterprise (the brilliant Clem's Garden* in Huddersfield) when we received a request for help to shift a whole lot of topsoil and compost.

Of course, we cheerfully accepted & on a beautiful Autumn day we embarked upon our task. The topsoil & compost required moving to a raised bed (but not just any raised bed ... probably the longest



raised bed in West Yorkshire!) as plans to get all bulbs safely in place prior to fast approaching cold weather & frosts required a jump start. It was hard work & quite an ambitious task to get the bed filled in time, but here at Transformers North we love a challenge and our gang displayed outstanding teamwork to not only wheel-barrow tonnes of topsoil and compost to fill the bed, but also have time to plant thousands of narcissi bulbs too! We had a brilliant day; made new friends (both human and feline!); enjoyed fab hospitality (including homemade cakes ... which went down a treat!) and it was fantastic to have the chance to work alongside a like-minded social

enterprise.

We also got a request for our assistance with a fantastic project initiated by the Friends of Crow Nest Park. We were tasked with cutting pallets into Christmas tree shapes to be distributed amongst local schools for the children to decorate & display in the park



at the December Christmas event; Dewsbury MP Paula Sherriff will be judging & awarding a prize for her favourite one!

We also took the chance to wear our creative hats in preparation for our stall at the Christmas event; our gang hand-crafted some wonderful yuletide items!



In November, we got to team up again with our old pals the Ravensthorpe Residents Action Group (RRAG) to tackle the second phase of their management plan for the bird sanctuary area of Dewsbury Country Park.

The last time we joined forces was in March (just prior to bird nesting season) & now that our feathered friends have vacated the area we were back to lend our help. Our task was to clear trees & overhanging branches adjacent to paths & walkways to ensure better definition of pathways & open up the canopy; providing a much lighter, clearer route to promote a safer environment & hopefully discourage anti-social behaviour.
