Bee A Happy Gardener – A talk by Sean Downey



Sean will be talking about the importance of pollinators, especially our native solitary bees and Bumble bees.

Sean is a Bluebell Garden club Committee member and was born in Grays, Essex. He started growing plants over 50 years ago, which soon attracted bees and butterflies, developing a lifelong love of nature.

Sean worked for 40.5 years in Telecommunications Engineering in various locations within the UK and Ireland.

In 1987 Sean moved up to Huddersfield and started to become interested in a more organic type of growing strategy, with the aim of encouraging more bees, butterflies, and other pollinators into his garden.

Around 2010 he decided to use the lawn mower less and allowed part of his lawn to become a wildflower area.

Since retiring in 2021, Sean has been a volunteer at his local school garden club, helping to encourage the next generation of plantaholics.
